## **Recommended preservation websites:**

The National Archives of Australia maintains a very useful site of "Archives Advices" that give information on preserving records within an organisation. There are 23 topics of downloadable information either in .html or Word files. Some of these were distributed to NTRBs at the end of 2005.

Within Australia, the "Preserving Access to Digital Information" site, run by the National Library of Australia, gives comprehensive information on working with digital materials, from web use to rights management. http://www.nla.gov.au/padi/
